

# Peer-Review Statements

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All of the articles in this proceedings volume have been presented at the 2<sup>nd</sup> ICoETS during October 4-5, 2023 in Sigli, Aceh, Indonesia. These articles have been peer reviewed by the members of the reviewer committee and approved by the Editor-in-Chief, who affirms that this document is a truthful description of the conference's review process.

## 1. REVIEW PROCEDURE

The reviews were single-blind. Each submission was examined by a reviewer independently. The submissions were first screened for generic quality and suitability. After the initial screening, they were sent for peer review by matching each paper's topic with the reviewers' expertise, taking into account any competing interests. A paper was considered for acceptance if it had received favourable recommendations from the reviewer.

Authors of a rejected submission were given the opportunity to revise and resubmit after addressing the reviewers' comments. The acceptance or rejection of a revised manuscript was final.

The paper was also checked for its similarity. If the paper has the similarity greater than 10%, the authors were asked to revise their paper.

## 2. QUALITY CRITERIA

Reviewers were instructed to assess the quality of submissions solely based on the academic merit of their content along the following dimensions:

1. Pertinence of the article's content to the scope and themes of the conference;
2. Clear demonstration of originality and novelty;
3. Soundness of the methods, analyses, and results;
4. Adherence to the ethical standards and codes of conduct relevant to the research field;

5. Clarity, cohesion, and accuracy in language and other modes of expression, including figures and tables.

6. The relevancy of references being used.

In addition, all of the articles have been checked for textual overlap in an effort to detect possible signs of plagiarism by the publisher. All articles have also been checked for its similarity to make sure the originality of the articles.

- Article 109 of the Job Creation Law amends the provisions in Article 7 and add article 153A of the PT Law which regulates the minimum requirement of 2 people to form a limited liability company. So that MSMEs founded by individuals (1 person) which previously could only become informal business entities, can now set up companies in the form of PT Individuals with legal entity status.
- By obtaining status as a legal entity, MSME players have easy access to obtain capital loans from banks, especially referring to the principle of a legal entity which has important characteristics, namely related to the splitting of assets between its founder and the Limited Liability Company he founded.
